Building Resilience in Children: Tips for Parents

Resilience is the ability to bounce back from challenges, setbacks, and failures. It helps children: handle stress, develop effective problem solving strategies, build strong relationships and grow into confident and capable individuals.

Tips for Parents to help your child build resilience:

- 1. Praise Effort, Not Just Success: Focus on praising your child's hard work and effort, rather than just their achievements.
- 2. Encourage Learning from Mistakes: Help your child see mistakes as opportunities for growth and learning.
- 3. Model Healthy Coping Mechanisms: Show your child how to manage stress and anxiety in healthy ways, such as exercise, deep breathing, or talking about their feelings.
- 4. Provide Opportunities for Independence: Give your child chances to make choices and take risks in a safe and supportive environment.
