The OFS Tigers continue to progress and compete at the highest levels of sport at ACSIS Conference, Singapore National and World international levels.

OFS have been absolutely on fire, showing incredible skill, dedication, and teamwork that has earned them recognition in a wide range of sports and cementing the OFS name as one of the strongest sporting outfits in the country.

The Junior Swimming team has made us incredibly proud, being crowned the TOP INTERNATIONAL SCHOOL TEAM IN SINGAPORE at the recent Singapore Nationals! The swimmers have broken ACSIS and National records and achieved their biggest medal haul to date. OFS Swimmers qualified for and competed at the Swimming World Cup and have been selected to represent Singapore at the forthcoming South East Asia (AG) Championships. The swimmers this year have broken ACSIS as well as National records - some that have stood for 23 years!

In addition to the swimmers, the OFS Tigers have National Champion and National Gold Medalists among them.

Our OFS Tigers ACSIS teams have been dominant. Crowned as ACSIS Champions in everything from Badminton, Basketball, Cross Country, Football, Gymnastics, Swimming, Table Tennis, Tennis, Touch Rugby, Volleyball as well as achieving top 3 positions in Cricket Netball, Rugby and Volleyball. The Academic Year 2024-2025 saw the return of (Middle School) Track and Field as well as Softball to ACSIS competitions – while also increasing the provision for Badminton, Basketball, Football, Netball and Tennis.

Home tips: Try incorporating some movement, like a short walk, animal walks, or jumping jacks, before starting homework to help your child regulate their energy and focus more effectively. If you have concerns about your child's attention or regulation, an Occupational Therapist can help.
