

Principal's Message

Dear Parents and Students.

As we move into November, I would like to take a moment to reflect on the exciting learning experiences our students have enjoyed over the past month. October was filled with curiosity, exploration, and hands-on learning



as all grades embarked on their field trips. Our students connected their Units of Work to the world around them — from Grade Ones' walking across the Jubilee Bridge to explore significant tourist sights, to Grade Twos' theatre experience that brought storytelling and performance to life. Other highlights included visits to the Science Center by our Grade 3s where they participated in demonstrations and experiments related to electricity. Our Grade 4s deepened their understanding of animal adaptations by studying marine life at the Oceanarium, and Grade 5s explored the Chinese Heritage Museum, learning about the migration of people into Singapore. We believe that these field trips enrich classroom learning and allow our students to experience ideas and inquiries in authentic, real-world settings.

As we head into the latter part of November, we are excited to host our Sports Morning, where students will showcase their teamwork and school spirit. Our Elementary students will also be showcasing their creative and artistic talents in two annual events. The Art Exhibition will feature beautiful student artwork that celebrates creativity across the school and as the semester draws to a close, we look forward to our festive Holiday Concerts, where students will share songs and dances from different countries and cultures that are representative of their holiday traditions.

Finally, OFS is again teaming up with Food from the Heart, which is a local non profit organization that helps provide consistent and sustainable food support to the less fortunate through their food distribution programs here in Singapore. The collection period starts from Friday, 14 November through to 28 November 2025. All the food items collected will be donated and distributed to families in need in the local Singapore community. 
