GRADE 12 IB DP EXAMINATIONS

 Grade 12 students who are registered for any IB DP examination in May 2025 will be receiving an IB Examination Pack via post.



- This examination information package contains: personal examination schedule, examination regulations, requests for IB transcripts to universities and PIN codes for viewing the IB DP results in July.
- Ms. Trivedi, the IB DP Coordinator will be holding an assembly with the Grade 12 students on Tuesday, 15 April 2025, to go over all the IB DP Examination information guidelines with students.
- Study leave for IB examinations: The last formal day for Grade 12 IB courses is Thursday, 17 April 2025.
- Grade 12 students taking Grade 11 IB courses are expected to attend all lessons for those classes until Friday, 9 May 2025, unless they have an IB examination during that particular lesson.


National Schools Individual Championship



Creative Expressions in G9 MYP 1st Language French: A Unit on Slam Poetry

In our MYP 1st Language French class, students immersed themselves in the vibrant and expressive world of slam poetry. This unit was designed to teach students how to craft and perform slams, focusing on the unique elements that make this form of poetry so impactful. Students explored essential aspects such as vocabulary, poetic structure, delivery, tone, and stylistic effects, all of which contribute to creating a powerful and memorable slam.

Throughout the unit, students analysed examples of slam poetry, learning how poets use language to convey emotions, tell stories, and connect with their audience. They then applied


