PIONEER IB WORLD SCHOOL: ONLINE DIGITAL EXAM TRIAL

- Our school participated in the IB DP Digital Examinations Student Usability Trial from November to December 2024, alongside 45 global IB World Schools.
- Our participation contributed to advancing the Diploma Program's innovation, adaptability, and continuous improvement in learning technologies within international education.

The CORE EXPO

- The CORE EXPO took place on Monday, 13 January 2025, where approximately 50 Grade 12 students presented their EE, TOK, or CAS to both Grade 12 and Grade 11 students, with participation being optional but encouraged.
- The event offered Grade 11 students a valuable opportunity to learn about the IB Diploma core components.
- The session was highly successful, with strong engagement from both grade levels.



GRADE 12

Extended Essay (EE):

- Grade 12 students submitted their final EE on Thursday, 16 January 2025, marking the completion of the most important phase of the EE process.
- A special thanks to all EE Supervisors and Mr. Lee Woollard, the EE Coordinator, for their guidance.

Key Dates:

- Monday, 3 March to Wednesday, 12 March 2025: IB DP Mock Examinations (schedule available on the school website, individual timetables provided).
- Monday, 28 April to Wednesday, 21 May 2025: IB Examination period.
- Study leave begins for Full IB Diploma students and Grade 12 course students on Thursday, 17 April 2025.

GRADE 11

Extended Essay

- The Extended Essay process began in December 2024.
- Students attended an Extended Essay Carousel session in January to understand subject-specific expectations.
- By early January 2025, students were expected to have selected their subject and topic.
- Supervisors were assigned, and students met with them in late January.



CAS

Clubs and activities began on Tuesday, 4 February 2025. By the end of Grade 11, students should have completed two-thirds of their CAS requirements. It is crucial for students to plan and select suitable

CAS Requirements

- Must be active in CAS over 18 months (starting in G11)
- Complete CAS Requirements over three semesters: two semesters of Grade 11 and the first semester of Grade 12
- Complete a minimum of <u>two experiences in each CAS Strand</u> C, A, and S
- Complete a minimum of eight core experiences that are one semester
 in length and meet weekly
- Produce meaningful reflections for CAS experiences
- Meet each of the 7 CAS Learning Outcomes at least once
- Complete three interviews
- · Complete at least one CAS Project

GRADE 12 PROGRESS

Most decisions from universities (particularly from the US) will not be received until March 2025, but we are very proud of their success! Students have already started applying to Singapore and European universities, and we will continue to support those applications throughout Semester 2.

Students will start attending appointments with their Academic Advisor (AA) to plan their future goals, courses and university applications. Welcome Back


Happy New Year and a warm welcome to all our students, especially those who have just joined our school community!
