# Grade 6 Science - Experiencing the properties of Dry Ice

As an introduction to the Grade 6 Unit on "Matter and Change", Grade 6 students had an opportunity to explore the unique properties of Dry Ice. Dry Ice is a very cold substance which sublimes (turns directly from a solid to a gas) when placed in a warm room. Students were able to: make a spoon 'sing', quickly make ice from water, coloured bubbles, see a self-inflating balloon, low/frictionless motion amongst other tasks. The key concept is Change and the students will use models to explain the behaviour of matter and how it changes.

Throughout their studies, students will seek to answer Inquiry Questions including:

- What is matter?
- What is the model for particle arrangement in solid, liquid and gas?
- What change can happen to matter?
- How does the arrangement of particles account for the properties of matter?
- Can the particulate model account for all behaviour of matter?
