The Kindergarten Art Exhibition transformed our corridors into a professional gallery. Our young artists showcased impressive fine motor development and creative expressions through intricate pictures and painting and imaginative box constructions. Each grade level experimented with unique techniques and styles, demonstrating that our youngest learners have very big ideas. We hope you enjoyed viewing these masterpieces.

On 13 March 2026, our Parent-Student-Teacher Conferences, placed students confidently at the center of their learning journey. The children proudly guided their parents through Learning Centre activities and explaining their work in their Student Portfolios.

Games Days on 17 & 18 March was another highlight and dynamic display of teamwork, perseverance, and physical development. Moving in their colour teams, the children rotated through four specialized stations designed to challenge their gross motor skills. From practicing ball control and navigating balance and movement challenges to refining hand-eye coordination, the emphasis was on participation, effort, and striving for personal bests.

Together, the school community celebrated Neurodiversity Week from 16 to 20 March. The focus of the week was on celebrating individuality, strengths, and differences, reinforcing the idea that everyone is unique through a variety of activities. The children particularly enjoyed creating individual faces using loose parts, decorating rocks for a whole-kindergarten "Kindness Rocks" display, and wearing mismatched socks to school.

On 26 March, we celebrated Hari Raya Puasa. During a special assembly led by the Kindergarten teachers, the children explored the traditions and customs of Eid al-Fitr, also known as the Festival of Breaking the Fast. They learned about the meaningful values of gratitude, reflection, and community that are central to the celebration.

We are now enthusiastically preparing for our Kindergarten Concert on Friday, 24 April. This year's theme, "Movie Night," has already sparked great excitement. The children are busy learning their dance routines and practicing with dedication. They are incredibly excited to perform and cannot wait to share this special event with you.

Our Pre-K2 Pandas and Koalas classes have enjoyed engaging with their IEYC unit, "The Brilliant Bug Ball". The children were fascinated by the world of insects and mini-beasts, eagerly sharing what they had learned and making connections between their classroom experiences and insects that they found outside in the grassy playground or at home.

Throughout the unit, the children have made wonderful progress in their fine motor skills, particularly through the many art experiences they have explored. With an abundance of creative opportunities, the children have been busy painting, sculpting, constructing, and crafting a wide variety of insect-inspired artworks. They created quick-dry clay spiders, modelling clay ladybirds, paper ants, ink-drop butterflies, cardboard dragonflies, bowl spiders, and many

other imaginative mini-beasts. Each activity involved important hands-on skills such as cutting, gluing, painting, squeezing, shaping, and carefully assembling materials while paying close attention to details. These experiences

have helped strengthen the children's eye-hand coordination and artistic confidence.

The art opportunities also connected closely with what the children have been learning about insects. As they created their mini-beast masterpieces, they explored and discussed the different body parts of insects, such as wings, legs, and antennae, and considered how these creatures move – whether they crawl, hop, or fly. Many activities also introduced simple mathematical ideas, including recognising patterns and exploring symmetry when designing wings or arranging decorative elements. Through these creative tasks, the children were able to deepen their understanding while expressing their imagination.

We hope that both parents and children enjoyed viewing these wonderful creations during the Kindergarten Art Exhibition. It was a special opportunity to celebrate the effort and creativity that the children put into their work.
