Our IEYC unit, *Going Places*, has focused on exploring transportation across land, sea, and air through a range of exciting journeys. The children have shown great enthusiasm and curiosity throughout the unit.

For our Entry Point, the children went on a magical "carpet ride," where they discovered different types of transportation and "travelled" to exciting destinations. Around the school, we also enjoyed mini field trips—visiting the bicycle bay, exploring parts of a car in the car park while learning about safety, and touring the school bus at the bus bay. One of the highlights was visiting the 10th floor of OFS, where we observed land, sea, and air transportation from a bird's-eye view.

To deepen their understanding of sea and air travel, we transformed our classroom into an immersive environment. It features a "sea" with rowboats and oars, a treasure island filled with sparkling gems, and an airport with an airplane setting. Each day, our "plane" takes off to a new country, giving us the opportunity to explore where our classmates come from.

The Bunnies have had a truly wonderful year, full of growth and joyful learning. They have become more independent, more confident in expressing themselves, increasingly curious about the world, and actively engaged in their learning.

Pre-K2 News

The Pre-K2 children thoroughly enjoyed their unit, Once Upon a Time. To spark their interest, Ms Khue arrived in the classroom with a special delivery—a mystery treasure box! The children took turns knocking on the box until it opened, revealing a collection of storybooks. From there, the children listened to and discussed stories such as Goldilocks and the Three Bears, The Enormous Turnip, The Gingerbread Man, and The Three Billy Goats Gruff. They developed early reading skills by retelling simple summaries, discussing characters' motivations, and making predictions about what might happen next. Our Pre-K2s also became little actors and actresses, confidently reenacting these stories using the puppet theatre, the gingerbread house, and by "going into character" with masks. Inspired by The Enormous Turnip, the children opened a fruit and vegetable shop outdoors, where they bought and sold produce while taking on the roles of shopkeepers and customers. They also made real vegetable soup in the cooking room, carefully cutting vegetables and adding them to the pot. The children showed great adaptability and enthusiasm—everyone gave the soup a try afterwards!



During our Movie Night concert, the children also developed confidence as performers and practised being respectful audience members. They gave a marvelous dance performance to the soundtrack from the Shrek movie. These skills continue to support their growing confidence as they act out and perform stories in the classroom.

As the unit, and the school year itself, draws to a close, the children will have the opportunity to perform The Three Billy Goats Gruff on stage, and for our final story, The Hare and the Tortoise, the children will take part in fun races, learning important values such as perseverance and being a good sport.

We have truly enjoyed teaching the Pre-K2s, who have been marvellous actors and actresses, eager bug explorers, fantastic toy-makers, and calm yoga masters throughout our four units this year. We wish them a wonderful start to K1 in the next academic year.
