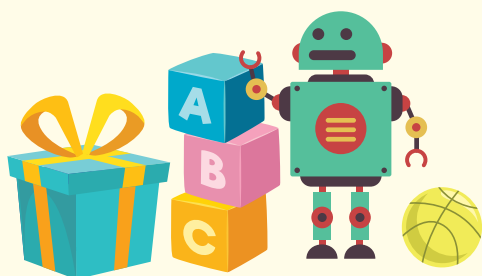
K2 News
